## Paper Crowns

4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4×4

## Background:

Crackers were invented in England in the mid-1840s. With one person pulling at each end, the cracker soon snaps open and treats fall out! Paper crowns are often found in crackers.

## Directions:

1. Take a piece of tissue paper (adults and older children may need two pieces). Fold the paper in half three times.

- 2. Cut triangles out of the top edge of the crown. Do not cut on one of the folded edges.
- 3. Unfold the paper.
- 4. Decorate one side with markers.
- 5. Tape the ends together.
- 6. Try on your crown.
- 7. Fold your crown and put it in your cracker.
