

Paper Crowns

Background:

Crackers were invented in England in the mid-1840s. With one person pulling at each end, the cracker soon snaps open and treats fall out! Paper crowns are often found in crackers.

Directions:

1. Take a piece of tissue paper (adults and older children may need two pieces). Fold the paper in half three times.
2. Cut triangles out of the top edge of the crown. Do not cut on one of the folded edges.
3. Unfold the paper.
4. Decorate one side with markers.
5. Tape the ends together.
6. Try on your crown.
7. Fold your crown and put it in your cracker.
