






County Seat

Read the story. Then, find the underlined words from the story in the puzzle.

During the Gold Rush, <u>gold</u> was not discovered on the <u>Peninsula</u>. However, the 49ers needed the local <u>redwood</u> trees for San Francisco, the fastest growing city in the world in the early 1850s. <u>Lumber</u> was needed to build <u>wharves</u>, warehouses, hotels, business offices, stores and homes.

Loggers cut down the redwood trees in the Woodside area. Oxen pulled the logs to San Francisco Bay. At first, the logs were tied together into rafts and floated up to San Francisco. Later, an embarcadero or wharf was built. Cut lumber from the fourteen sawmills into the area were loaded on to scow schooners. These flat-bottomed ships carried the lumber to San Francisco. Around the embarcadero. merchants started other businesses. The town of Redwood City was born. The port was the center of downtown activity.


In 1856, <u>residents</u> of the new county voted on which town would be the county <u>seat</u> or <u>headquarters</u> of local government. While some voted to make <u>Belmont</u> the county seat, Redwood City was selected. It was the largest town in the area. By 1858, the first <u>courthouse</u> was built near the lumber yards.



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Elections

In the county's first election in 1856, eligible voters were United States citizens who had been living in California for 6 months and in this area for 30 days. They had to be white or *Californio* (someone born in California of Hispanic descent). They had to be at least 21 years old. Only men were able to vote. Women in California did not receive the right to vote until Equal Suffrage (Proposition 4) passed in October 1911. Many women voted for the first time in the 1912 presidential election. In some parts of the United States, women could not vote until the 19th Amendment to the Constitution became law in 1920.





Sheriff's Office


Read the story about the Sheriff's Office. Then, find the underlined words from the story in the puzzle.

Lumberman John W. <u>Ackerson</u> was elected as the first <u>Sheriff</u> of San Mateo County in 1857. Silas Hovius was a Coastside <u>farmer</u> before serving for two years as the second sheriff.

Starting in 1951, Sheriff Earl B. Whitmore is credited with bringing <u>modern</u> policing standards to the Sheriff's Office. He opened <u>sub-stations</u> at Mills Field, Half Moon Bay, Sharp Park and Brisbane. He standardized police <u>radios</u> in all <u>patrol</u> cars. Crash wagons were created by outfitting <u>ambulances</u> with police protection, <u>investigation</u> and <u>rescue</u> equipment. A <u>Crime</u> Lab was created for the detection and <u>examination</u> of <u>evidence</u>.

Currently, there are over 800 <u>sworn</u> and civilian personnel in the Sheriff's Office. They provide law <u>enforcement</u> throughout the County, including <u>police</u> services for Caltrain, SamTrans, San Carlos, Woodside and Potola Valley. The Sheriff's Office mission includes <u>protecting</u> life and property, enforcing laws, <u>preventing</u> crime, supporting positive youth development, catching <u>criminals</u> and coordinating <u>emergency</u> services.

___3. Third Courthouse, 1906


The third courthouse was nearing completion when it was destroyed by an earthquake.

Featuring a dome, this courthouse was home to all county government.


___5. Hall of Justice and Records,1955

A new building better fit modern court needs.




Fire Department




In 1887, the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors appointed a Fire Commission to protect the natural resources found throughout the County. Today, the San Mateo County Fire Department (SMCFD) provides fire protection, medical response, hazardous materials response, fire safety inspections, fire marshal duties, community education, emergency preparedness and planning for most unincorporated areas of San Mateo County.

Decode the 9-1-1 call received by Public Safety Communications by finding each substitute letter.











San Mateo County acquired the Half Moon Bay Airport from the Navy in 1947.




Help the hiker find his way to the campground!

Founded in 1876, the San Mateo <u>Poor Farm</u> served as San Mateo County's first hospital. People unable to care for themselves for <u>medical</u> reasons ended up at the <u>hospital</u>. Poor people housed on the property were required to provide <u>food</u> and care for the <u>sick</u>.

In 1923, a modern hospital was built. San Mateo County <u>Community</u> Hospital's original purpose was to serve people with <u>communicable diseases</u> — ones that easily move from person to person.


The hospital has been known by many names including Harold D. <u>Chope</u> Community Hospital. Chope was the county's director of <u>health</u> and <u>welfare</u> for many years.

Known today as the San Mateo Medical <u>Center</u>, it is a hospital and <u>clinic</u> system serving healthcare needs with an emphasis on <u>education</u> and <u>prevention</u>.


